1.1.3 Vision, Mission and Key Objectives

The Directorate of Arecanut and Spices Development, Calicut has the mandate for the development of spices, arecanut, a large group of aromatic plants and betel vine grown in the country at the National Level. The Directorate discharges the above function through the overall coordination of all the development activities implemented by different agencies like State Government Departments, State Agricultural Universities (SAU), ICAR Institutes etc. In addition, the Directorate undertakes implementation of certain critical programmes which are of vital importance int eh development process.

The Directorate is responsible for coordinating and monitoring programmes under Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH) to promote holistic growth of the horticulture sector in the country.

- Assessment of the developmental needs of the mandate crops.
- Formulation of Central Sector / Centrally Sponsored Schemes and implementation of the same either directly or through the State Governments, SAUs, ICAR Institutes etc.
- Monitoring the implementation of Central Sector / Centrally Sponsored Schemes and coordinating the development activities.
- Rendering technical assistance to State Governments and other agencies on commodity development programmes.
- Collection and compilation of statistics of area, production, export, import, prices etc. and dissemination of the same to the Central and State Governments and other agencies.
- Keeping liaison with the research institutes and extension agencies and acting as a two-way channel in the transfer of technology.
- Undertaking the publicity and extension works relating to the arecanut, spicesand aromatic crops
- Assisting the Central and State Governments on all matters relating to the development of the commodities.

 Accreditation of spices nurseries in the country to regulate the quality of plantingmaterials

Development Programmes

Presently the Directorate is responsible for coordinating and monitoring of development programmes on spices under MIDH, which are being implemented in various States across the country. Besides, the Directorate is directly implementing the following programmes in association with SAUs and ICAR Institutes to supplement the efforts of the States.

- Production and Distribution of Planting Materials of Spices
- Accreditation of Spices Nurseries
- Establishment of Nursery Centres for Spices and Aromatic Plants
- Setting up of Seed Processing and Storage Infrastructure
- Technology Dissemination through Frontline Demonstration
- Organising National Seminars/Workshops/Training Programmes on Spices and Aromatic Plants

Statistics

The Directorate is the authority for collection, compilation and dissemination of statistics on spices and arecanut. The Directorate has been periodically publishing the statistics on area, production, productivity, prices and cost of cultivation of arecanut and spices.

a) Development Section

- Assessment of the production requirement to meet the domestic as well as export demand.
- Identifying the development needs of the commodities and their potential centres of cultivation in the country.
- Analyzing the constraints existing for attaining the required production level.
- Formulation of suitable development programmes to attain the production levels set for different plan periods.
- Execution of the programmes through different development agencies.
- Overall monitoring of the development activities to ensure the achievements of targets set in the plan documents.
- Setting up a linkage with development agencies, trade & marketing channels and research.

b) Marketing, Economic Research & Statistics Section

- Assessment of area and production of different commodities. Collection and compilation of data related to cost of production, price trend etc.
- Over viewing the export demand, export trend and their contribution to the national economy.
- Dissemination of the generated data to all the development agencies, traders, exporters etc.


c) Publicity Section

1.2 Power and duties of its officers and employees [Section 4(1)(b)lii)]

1.2.1 Powers and duties of officers (administrative, financial and judicial)

Director

To attend all administrative and executive work connected with the development, cultivation, marketing, economic research and statistics, extension and publicity, etc.,in respect of Arecanut, Spices and Aromatic plants in the country. Member of various Committees, working groups constituted by Govt. of India, Member of various Commodity Committees constituted by the Central and State Governments to look into the development aspects of crops dealt with by the Directorate. Rendering technical advice on crop development to Central and State Government, quasi- government organizations and to the public. National Coordinator on production and development of arecanut, spices and aromatic plants.

Deputy Director

Assisting the Director in planning and co-ordination of development of different cropsdealt with by the Directorate. All work connected with development of arecanut, spices, betel vine & aromatic plants cultivated in India. Critical assessment of the developmental needs of the crops, area under cultivation, production, productivity, quality of produce, etc and formulation, implementation and monitoring of development schemes. Liaison with different Central and State Government Departments/Agencies and Autonomous Organizations concerned with crop development and to provide them necessary assistance and guidance in planning and implementing their own development programmes. Supervising work connected with Publications, establishment and administrative matters including accounts. All other works assigned by the Director.

Assistant Director

To assist Deputy Director and Director in the formulation and effective implementation of various development programmes pertaining to the crops dealt with by the Directorate. Monitoring the implementation of the Central and StateSector programmes on the crops concerned with the Directorate. To undertakeperiodical field visits to the scheme implementing centers for rendering technical guidance, arranging planting materials and various other inputs required for the programme and review of the progress of implementation. All other works assigned by the Director.

Research Officer

Assist Deputy Director and Director in Planning and conducting Economic Research and Statistical Studies on area production, cost of cultivation, price trends, etc., of arecanut, spices and aromatic plants. Supervision of routine work pertaining to collection, compilation and analysis of data on area production, all mandatory crops, conduct survey for forecast of pepper production and all matters pertaining to all crops in so far as they

relate to economic and research and statistics. All the works assigned by the Director.

1.2.2 Powers and duties of other employees

Superintendent

Supervision of all works in Establishment, Accounts, and Administration Sections of the Directorate. Work related to recording and indexing, maintenance of office premises, files related to Confidential Dossiers of Officers and Staff, Vigilance and other confidential matters.

Senior Technical Assistant

Collection and compilation of progress reports, preparation of technical reports connected with crop development activities of spices and other crops dealt by the Directorate.

Statistical Investigator

Scrutiny, compilation, analysis and interpretation of statistical aspects of the crops. conducting field studies on cost of production, price structures, preparing fortnightly reports on area, production, productivity, etc.

Junior Translation Officer

To attend all translation works, conducts Hindi Workshop, Seminars, all work relatesto Official Language Implementation Committee, to attend Hindi meetings, etc.

Artist Photographer

To prepare all publicity materials, including layouts, maps, charts, graphs, posters, boards, etc., required for the publication on arecanut, spices and also for exhibition and general distribution to the cultivators. To prepare photographs and other illustrations, etc., required for the pamphlets, journals, folders, etc. to be issued bythe Directorate. Purchase and upkeep art and photographic materials andmaintenance of stock register.

Stenographer Grade-II

To take dictation in shorthand and its transcription, fixing up appointments and if necessary cancelling them; screening the telephone calls and the visitors in a tactful manner; keeping an accurate list of engagements, meetings, etc. and reminding the officer sufficiently in advance for keeping them up; maintaining, in proper order, the papers required to be retained by the officer; keeping a note of the movement of all incoming & outgoing papers, files, etc., destroying by burning the stenographic record of the confidential and secret letters after they have been typed and issued; carrying out corrections to the Officers reference books and making fair copies of draft demi-official letters to be signed by the officer.

Upper Division Clerk

To work under the supervision of the Section-in-charge and is responsible for the work entrusted to him. Where the line of action on a case is clear or clear instructions have been given by the Section-in-charge or higher officers, he should put up a draft without much noting. In other cases, he will put up a note keeping in view the following points:. (i) to see whether all facts open to check, have been correctly stated; (ii) to point out any mistakes or incorrect statement of the facts; (iii) to draw attention, where necessary, to precedents or Rules and Regulations on the subject; (v) to bring out clearly the questions under consideration and suggest a course of action wherever possible.

Lower Division Clerk

Entrusted with work of routine nature, e.g. registration of Dak, maintenance of Section Diary, File Register, File Movement Register, indexing & recording, typing, comparing, photocopying, faxing, emailing, etc., despatch, preparation of arrears and other statements, supervision of correction of reference books and submission of routine and simple drafts, etc.

Driver

Driving the office Jeep. Proper cleaning and maintenance of car, maintenance of log book, records of petrol/consumption. Also responsible to get service/repair of vehicle under his direct supervision.

Multitasking Staff

Physical maintenance of records of the section, general cleanliness and upkeep of the section, carrying files and other papers within the building, photocopying, sending fax, assisting routine work like diary, dispatch etc. including work on computer, delivering of dak including outside the building, watch and ward duties, dusting of furniture, cleaning of building, fixtures, upkeep of parks, lawns, potted plants etc.

Conditions for exercising the financial powers:-

- Exercise of financial powers against each item shall be exercised as per conditions and restrictions laid in column nos. 3, 4 & 5. Beyond the delegated financial powers, concurrence of IFD will be required in all cases.
- The codal provisions as laid down in GFR-2017 and the procedures laid downin orders issued by Ministry of Finance, DoP&T, Ministry of Law & Justice, Ministry of Urban Development and Central Vigilance Commission from time to time shall continue to govern the delegation of financial powers contained in this order.
- 3. The exercise of the delegation of financial powers for procurement of goods and services will be done in accordance with GFR 2017, DFPR 1978 as amended from time to time, Manual for Procurement of Goods-2017, Manual for Procurement of consultancy & Other Servies-2017 and Manual on procurement of works issued by Ministry of Finance including guidelines issued by CVC from time to time. GFR mandates that goods and services available in GeM portal has to be procured from GeM Portal only.
- Delegated Powers will not be exercised on single tender basis/ single vendor basis/ nomination basis/ single offer basis if it is not supported by Ministry of Finance orders. Procurement guidelines promulgated vide order of DOE dated 29.10.2021 to be scrupulously followed for all cases.
- Delegated powers will not be further re-delegated to subordinate officer and Head of Department/Head of Office will be responsible for the correctness, regularity and propriety of the decisions taken by them within delegated powers so authorized.
- All expenditure to be made within Budget provision and ensuring the same will be responsibility of HOD/HOO concerned.




